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I. General

1. National Institutes of Technology (NITs), Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology (IIST), Indian Institutes of Information Technology (IIITs), Schools of Planning and Architecture (SPAs), a few other technical Institutes funded fully or partially by the central or a state government (Other-GFTIs) and a few other Premier Technical Institutes offer academic programs for Foreign Nationals / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) / Non-Resident Indians (NRIs) under Direct Admission of Students Abroad (DASA) Scheme of Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India for which the admission is on the basis of JEE (Main) 2025.

Qualifying in the examinations mentioned above does not guarantee admission in any of the institutes. Each institute / academic program may have additional eligibility requirements. Candidates have to meet all the eligibility requirements to obtain admission.

The names of NITs, IIST, IIITs, Other-GFTIs and a few other Premier Institutes are listed in **Annexure 1**.

It is mandatory for the candidates to register through “DASA and CSAB-Special” Seat Allocation portal to obtain seats to be allocated through DASA 2025 in any of the NITs, IIST, IIITs, Other-GFTIs and a few other Premier Institutes as mentioned in Annexure 1. The portal can be reached at <https://dasanit.org> or <https://csab.nic.in>.

The academic programs, along with the category-wise intake capacity known as seat matrix, will be announced on the online portal.

The information brochure stated herein will be strictly followed for allocating seats for the above-referenced academic programs for the academic year 2025-26, through DASA seat allocation scheme for the NITs, IIST, IIITs, Other-GFTIs and a few other Premier Technical Institutes.

Seats to be allocated for admission through DASA scheme will be supernumerary. The total number of supernumerary seats allocated in each of the above institutes for admission through DASA scheme is limited to up to 15% of the total number of seats of the respective institutes, program-wise.

There are various provisions contained in this Information Brochure which may not be reversible. The candidates are strongly advised to exercise their options carefully within the stipulated timeframe and may seek guidance through the grievance redressal mechanism (see Section XII) provided in this Information Brochure.

The seat allocation process follows a strict timeline. The entire process is on-line and computer operated. No exceptions are possible and therefore, candidates are strongly advised to thoroughly acquaint themselves with these rules laid in this Information Brochure, be vigilant, keep their documents handy and make arrangements for making the requisite payments and completing the requisite formalities, well in advance. It will not be possible to entertain requests for extension of time for completing any activity.

2. A candidate chooses and applies to a series of academic programs in a certain order of preference.

In the context of seat allocation, “academic program” refers to the combination of academic program and institute. For example, a 4-year B.Tech. degree in

Computer Science and Engineering at NIT Rourkela is referred to as an “academic program”.

A seat to the highest possible choice of academic program is allocated to the candidate considering the following factors:

- (i) The candidate’s category tag [DASA (Non-SAARC), DASA (SAARC), DASA-CIWG] (see Section IV).
- (ii) The position of the candidate in the Common Rank List (CRL).
- (iii) The order of preference of academic programs selected by the candidate.
- (iv) The availability of seats in different seat categories / seat quotas for which the candidate is eligible.
- (v) Other rules as mentioned in this document.

II. Entities

- 3. The JEE Apex Board conducts JEE (Main) 2025 and the Direct Admission of Students Abroad (DASA) 2025 frames the policies and norms for seat allocation to NITs, IEST, IITs, Other-GFTIs and a few other Premier Technical Institutes for Foreign Nationals / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) / Non-Resident Indians (NRIs) candidates.

National Informatics Center (NIC) will extend its technical support and expertise for providing the services of e-Counselling and Admission for the above said activities carried out by DASA 2025.

No agency other than DASA 2025 is responsible for seat allocation of Foreign Nationals / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) / Non-Resident Indians (NRIs) candidates through Direct Admission of Students Abroad (DASA) scheme of GoI to the seats at the NITs, IEST, IITs, Other-GFTIs, and a few other Premier Institutes as mentioned in **Annexure 1**. Candidates seeking information / assistance from any agency / agent other

than DASA 2025 shall be doing so at their own risk and cost. The official portal can be reached either at <https://dasanit.org> or at <https://csab.nic.in> only.

III. Who can participate in the DASA seat allocation process

4. Eligibility Criteria

Nationality: Candidates who are of Foreign Nationals or Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) or Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) or Non-Resident Indians (NRIs) are eligible.

Age: Candidates born on or after October 01, 2000, are eligible. Date of birth as recorded in the Secondary Education Board / University Certificate [Class X or equivalent] or any certificate issued by the Government authorities only will be taken as authentic.

Academic Eligibility: Candidate should have valid JEE (Main) 2025 rank(s) of B.E./B.Tech. paper for B.E./B.Tech. programs and/or B.Arch. Paper for B.Arch. programs and/or B.Plan. Paper for B.Plan. program.

In addition, candidates must satisfy the performance in Class XII (that is Senior Secondary [10+2]) or equivalent [See **Annexure 2**] from any system of education as recognized by the Association of Indian Universities (www.aiu.ac.in) with specified subjects as mentioned below. Candidates appearing Class XII or equivalent in the academic year 2024-25 and expecting their final results latest by September 30, 2025, may also apply.

- For B.E./B.Tech.: Candidates should have successfully completed Mathematics, Physics and one of the subjects from (Chemistry, Biotechnology, Computer Science, Biology) in Class XII with 75% marks (CGPA of 7.5 out of 10) in aggregate, as applicable in the respective boards.
- For B.Arch.: No candidate shall be admitted to architecture course unless she/he has passed 10+2 scheme of examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics or passed 10+3 diploma examination with mathematics as compulsory subject. The candidate should have secured 75% marks (7.5

CGPA out 10) in aggregate in the qualifying examination, as applicable in the respective boards.

- For B. Plan.: No candidate shall be admitted to planning course unless she/he has passed 10+2 scheme of examination with mathematics. The candidate should have secured 75% marks (OR 7.5 CGPA out of 10) in aggregate in the qualifying examination, as applicable in the respective boards.

Residential Requirement: All foreign nationals studying in any country including India or Indian nationals studying abroad who fulfill prescribed admission criteria shall be eligible. Prescribed admission criteria for Indian Nationals shall be at least two years of education, inclusive of 11th and 12th or equivalent (not beyond), in a foreign country during the last 8 years and must pass the same from abroad.

Candidates eligible for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025 are advised to refer the document entitled *Important information for candidates registering for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025*, which is available in the website <https://csab.nic.in> and <https://dasanit.org>.

IV. Categorization of seats and candidates

5. All available seats in DASA scheme are referred as DASA-GEN seats. However, 5% seats (within 15% of supernumerary quota of DASA) are reserved for Children of Indian Workers in Gulf (CIWG). In other words, one-third seats from DASA seats are reserved for CIWG. Such seats are referred as CIWG seats. All DASA-GEN seats other than CIWG seats are referred as Non-CIWG seats. During seat allocation at Round-III, any vacant seat out of the 5% reserved for CIWG shall be reverted to Non-CIWG seats.

The following Gulf countries fall under CIWG: United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Iraq, Iran, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, and Saudi Arabia.

6. In order to avail the benefit of CIWG, either of the parents of the candidate must be working or have worked till any date of year 2025. Documents to be produced by the candidate are enumerated in **Annexure 5**.

7. For the purpose of seat allocation, each qualified candidate is categorized based on nationality as given below:

- (i) Category tag DASA (SAARC): This is assigned to Foreign Nationals / Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs), who are nationals of SAARC countries (except India).
- (ii) Category tag DASA (Non-SAARC): This is assigned to Foreign Nationals / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs), who are NOT nationals of SAARC countries. This tag is also assigned to Non-Resident Indian (NRI).
- (iii) Category tag DASA-CIWG: This is assigned to Non- Resident Indians (NRIs) whose either OR both of the parent are working in gulf country [United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Iraq, Iran, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia].

NRI candidates who are eligible for CIWG seats will have the option to be considered for Non-CIWG seats as well under DASA (Non-SAARC) category tag only. Further details in this regard are delineated in Clauses 12 and 27.

Candidates eligible for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025 are advised to refer the document entitled ***Important information for candidates registering for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025***, which is available in the website <https://csab.nic.in> and <https://dasanit.org>.

V. DASA seat allocation process

8. The seat allocation process of DASA scheme involves the following stages:

- (i) Registration
- (ii) Payment of DASA Enrolment Fee (DEF)
- (iii) Upload the Documents
- (iv) Document Verification and Respond to Queries, if any
- (v) Payment of Balance DEF, if applicable
- (vi) Online Choice Filling and Locking

(vii) Round-I

- a. Seat Allotment
- b. Online Reporting
 - Exercising willingness

(viii) Round-II

- a. Seat Allotment
- b. Online Reporting
 - Exercising willingness

(ix) Round-III

- a. Seat Allotment
- b. All allotments are presumed to be accepted

(x) Physical Reporting at the Admitting Institute

Each of the above stages are described in-detailed in the following clauses.

Eligible candidates willing to fill choices for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025 are advised to refer the document entitled ***Important information for candidates registering for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025***, which is available in the website <https://csab.nic.in> and <https://dasanit.org>.

9. All DASA eligible candidates willing to participate in DASA seat allotment process are required to login to “DASA and CSAB-Special” Seat Allocation portal using the same credentials that they used in JEE (Main) 2025: Login with JEE (Main) 2025 Application Number and Password. After logging in, the candidate must proceed to further steps such as registration, payment of DASA Enrolment Fee (DEF), document uploading and respond to queries during document verification (if any), and choice filling. The detailed instructions for completion of the above steps shall be made available in the website.

(i) Registration

10. Once logged in, all eligible candidates must register for DASA 2025 seat allocation as per the schedule (**Annexure 3**). In the online portal, each candidate will be asked a set of questionnaires, viz. nationality, OCI/PIO status, CIWG status, etc. At the time of registration, candidates will NOT be allowed to change their personal details such as name, father's / mother's / guardian's name, date of birth, and Class XII (or equivalent) examination board. However, candidates can change their nationality, year and place as well as status of passing class XII (subject to conditions specified in Clause 59), and gender data. Note that the candidates whose documents are already verified at NIT+ System during JoSAA 2025 rounds cannot update their personal details including nationality and Class XII (or equivalent) passing status. In addition, candidates whose documents are verified at IIT system during JoSAA 2025, cannot update their nationality.

NRI or OCI/PIO candidates who have participated in JoSAA-2025 and have been allotted seats in NIT+ System and have already SECURED ADMISSION at the allotted institute by paying the Seat Acceptance Fee (SAF) and Partial Admission Fee (PAF), are also eligible for DASA seat allocation provided they fulfill the criteria as given in Section III. These candidates will be participating in DASA Rounds as fresh after payment of required DASA Enrollment Fee (DEF) as mentioned in clause 11 while retaining their seats for which they have paid PAF during JoSAA 2025 rounds. In case, a new seat is allotted in DASA Rounds, then their retained seats will **AUTOMATICALLY GET CANCELLED**, and candidates **will not have any claim** on the previously secured/retained seats. The declaration regarding the same is to be submitted at the time registration for DASA 2025. The format of the declaration/agreement is mentioned in **Annexure 4** of this document. For these candidates, balance amount (if any) will be refunded after adjustment as mentioned in **Annexure 6**.

Candidates who have secured admission against allocated IIT seat during JoSAA rounds, are also eligible to register for DASA 2025 seat allocation process as fresh candidates after payment of DEF as mentioned in clause 11, provided they meet the eligibility requirement of DASA.

Payment of DASA Enrolment Fee (DEF)

11. Depending on the answers to the above questionnaires, a candidate is assigned with either “Single Tag” or “Double Tag”, and accordingly is required to pay the below mentioned DASA Enrolment Fee (DEF) within the scheduled dates given in **Annexure 3**. DEF comprises non-refundable fee of US\$ 300 towards DASA-2025 registration and tuition fee of the first semester. Candidates have to remit DEF only once through the “pre-payment” mode.

*Foreign nationals, who are nationals of SAARC countries (except India), are eligible for 50% Tuition Fee waiver provided they have passed the qualifying examination in SAARC countries. They are required to pay an amount of US\$2300 towards DEF, which comprises a non-refundable registration fee of US\$300 plus US\$2000 tuition fee of the first semester.

For information regarding the balance tuition fee, if any (for candidates taking admissions in Institutions other than NITs and IEST Shibpur) and any

additional fee to be paid to the admitting institute at the time of admission, please visit the website of the allotted institute or contact them. DASA 2025 will not be responsible for any issues arising out of this.

Candidates are advised to visit the Institute website for fee structure for individual Institutes. DASA 2025 shall not be responsible for fee structure for individual Institutions.

12. NRI candidates who are eligible for CIWG seats will have the option to be considered for Non-CIWG seats as well under DASA (Non-SAARC) category tag only. In order to avail this option, the candidates have to deposit the same initial fee as applicable to DASA (Non-SAARC) category candidates, i.e., US\$ 4300 including non-refundable registration fee of US\$ 300. These candidates will be shown both CIWG and Non-CIWG seats (under DASA (Non-SAARC) category tag) as two different options for each academic program choice filling. They may fill in their choices for both types of seats in order of their preferences out of all available seats under both the categories of seat. In case, final admission is given in CIWG Category, balance amount of tuition fee will be refunded.
13. Candidates must remit the full payable amount in one transaction through online mode only wherein candidates may use Debit Card or Credit Card or Net Banking or UPI or e-challan (for INR transactions only). The detailed instructions for payment shall be made available in the website. Transaction charges, if any, shall be borne by the candidate.
14. The parents, living in India or abroad and willing to pay fee(s) prescribed under the DASA Scheme in Indian Rupees at existing exchange rate in place of US\$, are allowed to pay the prescribed fee in INR.
15. It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that the payment of DEF is successfully completed and the same is updated in the seat allocation portal within the stipulated time.

16. Candidates are strongly advised to make the payment well within time failing which their documents shall not be verified and therefore they cannot fill in any choice of academic programs and as a result such candidates will be out of seat allocation process. Such process is not reversible and no requests would be entertained, as the entire process is computerized.
17. All admitted candidates are required to pay the balance tuition fee (if any) plus other fees (as applicable) for the 1st semester and subsequent semesters of study at the admitting institute. The collected tuition fee of 1st Semester will be transferred from DASA to the respective admitting Institute.
18. Hostel fee and other expenses may vary from Institute to Institute and are required to be paid by the candidates directly to the Institution at the time of admission. Candidates are advised to visit the websites or contact concerned authorities of the respective Institutes for detailed information regarding hostel accommodation, its availability and other expenses. DASA 2025 is not responsible for arranging Hostel or other facilities at the individual Institutes.
19. **Refund of tuition fee and mode of refund:** The registration fee of US\$ 300 is non-refundable. The rules pertaining to tuition fee refund are listed in **Annexure 6**.

(ii) Upload the documents

20. The candidate MUST upload all the required documents (as per **Annexure 3**) on the portal.

(iii) Document Verification and Respond to queries (if any)

21. At the time of document verification, if the document verifying officer raises any query, the candidate must respond to the same in online mode (through candidate's portal) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) on time will lead to cancellation of the candidature and **the candidate will no longer be able to participate in the seat allocation process of DASA 2025**. It is the responsibility of the candidate to check the online

portal at regular intervals of time and respond to queries (if any) without fail within the stipulated time. No separate intimation will be given to the candidates in this regard.

22. During the process of document verification, if there is any mismatch between the document uploaded earlier by the candidate during JEE (Main) 2025 registration and the document uploaded by the candidate on the seat allocation portal, and the same is found to be due to willful forgery/act of cheating, the offer of admission will be withdrawn and the candidate shall be debarred from further rounds of seat allocation. Thus, the candidate will forfeit the eligibility for admissions to any of the institutes through DASA 2025. The decision of Chairman, DASA 2025 on this issue shall be final and binding.
23. If a foreign national fails to produce valid proof of foreign nationality (i.e., foreign passport or citizenship certificate), the candidature of the candidate will be cancelled.
24. In case of any discrepancies in the uploaded documents noticed during the online document verification process, query(ies) may be raised and will be notified to the candidate only on the online portal. Candidate must respond to the query(ies) (by uploading new/modified document(s), if required) within the last date/time specified for the given round [see **Annexure 3**]. The candidates are advised to check the online portal regularly for queries, if any. Additional query(ies) may be raised in case discrepancy(ies) still persist(s). In such cases, the candidate must respond to the additional query(ies) within the last date/time specified for the given round [**Annexure 3**]. If all the queries are resolved based on the validity of the document(s) uploaded and the candidate meets all the eligibility criteria then she/he will be allowed for choice filling and seat allocation process.

Failure to reply to the query(ies) raised would lead to cancellation of the candidature. In such cases, the candidate will NOT be considered for DASA 2025 seat allocation process.

25. Verification Center shall verify the uploaded documents and ensure that the candidate meets all the eligibility criteria. If all the documents are found to be valid and all the eligibility criteria are met by the candidate, the candidate will be allowed for choice filling and seat allocation process.
26. Seat will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the documents / certificates is/are found to be invalid / fraudulent and/or the candidate does not meet all / any of the eligibility norms.
27. During the document verification of DASA-CIWG category candidates who have not opted to be considered for Non-CIWG seats (under DASA (Non-SAARC) category), if their CIWG status could not be established based on the submitted documents, then the candidate will be asked to consider her/his candidature for Non-CIWG seats (under DASA (Non-SAARC) category). Upon confirmation, the candidate must pay the Balance DEF (Difference amount of DEF for DASA (non-SAARC) and DASA-CIWG) and fill in the choices of Non-CIWG seats, which will be considered for seat allocation. If the candidate declines to consider herself/himself for Non-CIWG seats or fails to pay the Balance DEF in the stipulated time as mentioned in **Annexure 3**, her/his candidature will not be considered for any of the DASA seats. Refund, if any, shall be governed by the rules laid in **Annexure 6**.
28. **Requirement of independent re-verification/online reporting:** The various cases of independent re-verification/online reporting for the candidates who have filled in choices in both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025 are delineated in the document entitled ***Important information for candidates registering for both DASA 2025 and CSAB-Special 2025***, which is available in the website <https://csab.nic.in> and <https://dasanit.org>.

29. **Availed the services of a scribe and/or compensatory time:** If it is found at any stage that a candidate has availed the services of a scribe and / or availed the compensatory time, but does not possess the requisite extent of disability, and/or does not have difficulty in writing, that warrants the use of a scribe and / or grant of compensatory time in JEE (Main) 2025, the candidate will be excluded from the process of seat allocation. In case such a candidate has already been admitted to any institute, the admission of the candidate will be cancelled.

(iv) Online Choice Filling and Locking

30. After successful fee payment and document verification, candidates are required to fill in their CHOICES of academic programs. Candidates are advised to carefully fill their CHOICES and save them frequently during the process. In case, choices filled in are not saved by the candidate, these will NOT be auto-saved by the system at the end of the choice filling stage and the unsaved choices shall not be considered for seat allocation. If the candidate has not saved at least one choice then she/he will NOT be considered for any seat allocation. The registered candidates whose documents are verified successfully, will be able to fill in their choices. Candidates are also advised to check the special eligibility criteria, if any, for the academic programs before making their choices. A list of such criteria is available in the website. All the filled in choices will be considered for allotment through DASA seat allocation process.
31. Both Non-CIWG seats (under DASA (Non-SAARC) category) and CIWG seats will be available for double tag candidates to fill their choice of academic programs. Single tag DASA-CIWG candidates whose CIWG status are not established during document verification, may fill in the choices of Non-CIWG seats as per Clause 27.

32. Candidates MUST “lock” their choices on or before the last day of choice filling. If the candidates do **NOT** lock their choices, their last saved choices will be locked automatically upon reaching the deadline for choice filling (as per the DASA 2025 schedule). If no choices are saved, the candidate will not be considered for allotment of any seat. Once locked, the choices filled by the candidates cannot be edited. Candidates willing to edit their locked choices may do so by submitting an online request from candidates’ portal well before the choice filling deadline. An OTP will be sent to the registered mobile number and email, which can be used to validate the unlock request. Once validated, candidate’s choices will be unlocked. Candidates will NOT be allowed to edit their choice-list after the deadline for choice filling, i.e., candidates CANNOT change the order of their choices OR add any more choices OR delete any choices from their choice-list after the deadline for choice filling.
33. Candidates must fill and save at least one choice of academic program to be considered for seat allotment. Candidates who failed to fill and save at least one choice will **NOT** be considered for seat allotment.
34. Candidates must **download and take a printout** of their locked choices. This printout consists of the terms and conditions as agreed by the candidates during choice filling.
35. Candidates are advised to take advantage of the mock seat allocations and choose ALL academic programs that they are willing to join in the order of preference. Candidates who want to take the advantage of mock seat allocations, should pay necessary DEF and upload the documents well before. Candidates must note that they will NOT be considered for those academic programs which are not part of their choice selection.
36. **Restrictions for Admission to Specific Programs:** Some of the academic programs in various institutes have special eligibility/restrictions for

admission based on the criteria laid by the participating institutes, which is available in the websites <https://csab.nic.in> and <https://dasanit.org>. It is the candidates' responsibility to ensure that they fulfill/satisfy special eligibility/restrictions of the academic program before they include the same in the list of choices. The special eligibility/restrictions of allotted academic program shall be verified at the time of admission, and in case a candidate fails to fulfill/satisfy, the admitting institute has the right to cancel the allocated seat.

Candidates are strongly discouraged from sharing their login information/credentials with others.

(v) Provisional offer of seat

37. Seat Allotment result will be published ONLINE only. Seat allotment will be carried out according to JEE (Main) 2025 Common Rank List (CRL). It is the candidate's responsibility to login to the portal and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation. No separate intimation of seat allocation will be given to the candidate. Schedule of DASA activities is available in **Annexure 3** of this document. When a candidate is allocated a seat for the first time in any round, steps of "Online Reporting" mentioned in Clause 38 MUST be completed in order to accept the allocated seat before deadline specified for the same round, which is the round in which seat is allocated.

The Common Rank List (CRL) provided by the JEE Apex Board 2025 will be used as such without any change even if two or more candidates have the same rank; in other words, DASA 2025 will NOT apply any tie-breaking norms / rules.

In the event that there is fewer number of seats available under a particular category in an academic program than the number of candidates with the same CRL seeking admission to the same program, then all those candidates will be offered seats by creating requisite number of additional supernumerary seats.

38. **Online Reporting:** A candidate who has been allocated a seat needs to download the “Initial Seat Allotment Intimation Slip” which has information regarding the Seat Allotment and steps to be followed for seat confirmation by the candidate.

Exercising willingness

The candidate needs to exercise the willingness mandatorily against the allocated seat by opting any one of the willingness ‘Freeze’, ‘Slide’, ‘Float’, ‘Surrender’, or, ‘Withdraw’ (see Section VI).

39. Candidates who are not exercising the available willingness option, will be AUTOMATICALLY MOVED to the next round (if any) with ‘**Float**’ as their DEFAULT willingness option. However, if s/he is allocated the seat of first choice then the default willingness option will be ‘**Freeze**’.

VI. Willingness options during the rounds

40. When a candidate is allocated a seat for the first time, during online reporting she/he has to opt for any one of the willingness options, i.e., ‘Freeze’, ‘Float’, ‘Slide’, ‘Surrender’, ‘Withdraw’, which will be applicable for the next round (if any) of seat allocation. The definition of each of these willingness terms is given in this clause. Candidates who are not exercising the available willingness option, will be AUTOMATICALLY MOVED to the next round (if any) with ‘**Float**’ as their DEFAULT willingness option. However, if s/he is allocated the seat of first choice then the default willingness option will be ‘**Freeze**’.

(A) Freeze:

Choosing the option “*Freeze*” means that the candidate accepts the offered seat and indicates that the candidate is content with the allocated academic program and that the candidate **does not want to participate in further rounds of seat allocation while retaining the same seat**. Such candidates will NOT be considered in subsequent rounds of seat allocation, if any. Their

chosen seat shall remain allocated to them and shall be provisionally confirmed.

(B) Float:

Choosing the option “Float” means that the candidate accepts the offered seat and indicates that, if an academic program of higher preference in **any Institute** is offered in subsequent rounds of seat allocation, the candidate will accept it. Else, the candidate will continue with the currently accepted academic program. Such candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of seat allocation, if any.

(C) Slide:

Choosing the option “Slide” means that the candidate accepts the offered seat and indicates that, if an academic program of higher preference is offered **within the same Institute** in subsequent rounds of seat allocation, the candidate will accept it. Such candidates will be considered in subsequent rounds of seat allocation, if any.

(D) Surrender:

Candidate REJECTS the allotted seat and wishes to participate in next Round of seat allotment. Hence the allotted seat will be cancelled. Allotment in the next round will be considered from the choices higher than the surrendered seat. The candidates who have secured a seat by paying PAF at the end of JoSAA 2025 rounds and have participated in “DASA and CSAB-Special” seat allocation process 2025 can also exercise ‘surrender’ option. **In such case, the candidate will lose the seat irrespective of whether she/he had secured the seat in JoSAA rounds or “DASA and CSAB-Special” rounds.** ‘Surrender’ option will not be available in the last round of seat allocation.

(E) Withdraw:

Candidate REJECTS the allotted/accepted seat and does not wish to participate in subsequent rounds of seat allotment. Hence the allotted/accepted

seat will be cancelled irrespective whether the seat was accepted during JoSAA rounds or it is allotted/accepted in “DASA and CSAB-Special” rounds. The candidate will be out of seat allocation process, i.e., she/he shall not be considered for subsequent round of seat allocation, if any. Further details on ‘Withdraw’ option are elaborated in Section VIII.

41. In case the candidate has been allocated a seat as per the candidate’s first choice, the candidate will not be shown ‘Float’, ‘Slide’, and ‘Surrender’ willingness options. In other words, the candidate has been allocated the best choice as per her/his choice list and therefore, she/he must exercise the willingness option of ‘Freeze’ in order to retain the seat. Candidates who are not exercising the willingness option in this case, the default willingness option will be **‘Freeze’** for these candidates.
42. In case the candidate has been allocated a seat which is other than the candidate’s first choice and the candidate wants to retain the seat then she/he **MUST** choose ‘Freeze’ option. In case the candidate wants to be considered for a higher choice in her/his list of choices by **RETAINING** the allocated seat, in subsequent rounds, the candidate **MUST** choose one of the available options (i.e., ‘Float’, ‘Slide’). If the candidate wishes to be considered for a higher choice in her/his list of choices by **REJECTING** the currently allocated seat, the candidate can choose ‘Surrender’ option. Candidates who are not exercising the available willingness option, will be **AUTOMATICALLY MOVED** to the next round (if any) with **‘Float’** as their **DEFAULT** willingness option. However, if s/he is allocated the seat of first choice then the default willingness option will be **‘Freeze’**.
43. For candidates who choose the ‘Float’ or ‘Slide’ option, allocation of a seat in an academic program of the candidate’s higher preference would automatically result in the replacement of the seat accepted by the candidate in the earlier round. Candidates will not have any claims on the previously allocated seats.

(Candidates are thus advised to fill in their list of choices carefully and exercise the options of Freeze, Float, Slide, Surrender, and Withdraw even more carefully).

44. In the last round, all allotments are presumed to be accepted with 'Freeze' option.
45. If a candidate opts 'Freeze' against a seat, the option cannot be changed to 'Float', 'Slide', or 'Surrender' in the subsequent rounds under any circumstances. No communication on this matter shall be entertained.
46. Exercised willingness continues to remain the same in case the candidate does not change the willingness in the subsequent rounds (if any). Candidates exercised 'Freeze' option cannot change to 'Float', 'Slide' or 'Surrender' options. Similarly, candidates exercised 'Slide' option cannot change to 'Float' or 'Surrender' option.
47. The following willingness is applicable only for those candidates who have NOT BEEN ALLOTTED any seat.

Exit: Those candidates who neither have a SECURED seat in JoSAA 2025 in NIT+ System nor have seat allocated till this round of "DASA and CSAB-Special" Seat Allocation Process 2025 can exercise the option of "EXIT", if they desire. This implies that the candidate is not willing to participate in subsequent rounds of seat allocation (if any). Further details on 'Exit' option are elaborated in Section IX.

VII. Physical reporting at the admitting institute

48. At the conclusion of DASA seat allocation and seat acceptance, candidates will have to report physically at the admitting institute, and complete all the admission formalities of the Institute including payment of balance Institute/Admission fees, if any, get the admission confirmed and begin the academic session. At the time of the physical reporting at the admitting

institute, all the certificates will be re-checked by the admitting Institute and the admission will be cancelled if these fail to meet the requirements as per the prevailing norms. Candidates allocated a seat are advised to refer to the respective admitting institute website for the schedule of Physical Reporting. At the time of admission or later, if any of the uploaded documents is found to be forged or fake, then the allocated seat and the candidature will be canceled. The final confirmation pertaining to the admission is subject to production of valid and original eligibility documents and their physical verification at the admitting institute. At any stage, if any of the documents is found to be invalid, the allotted seat along with the candidature will be cancelled.

VIII. Exercising ‘Withdraw’ option

49. A candidate, who has already accepted a seat in any of the institutes allotted by “DASA and CSAB-Special” Seat Allocation Process 2025, can withdraw the seat by reporting online and following the steps contained in Clause 52 below. This option is available till the 2nd round of seat allocation, i.e., before the last round of seat allocation [i.e. if DASA conducts a total of three rounds of seat allocation, candidates can withdraw up until second round of seat acceptance period end, i.e. till August 16, 2025 (17:00 Hrs. IST), but not thereafter. Please see **Annexure 3** for the timeline]
50. If a candidate withdraws a seat, the candidate’s allotted seat will be cancelled and offered to another candidate in a subsequent round of allotment. The candidate withdrawing the seat shall be excluded from the DASA seat allocation process, which means the candidate shall not be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allocation (if any). Such candidates will be refunded a part of DEF after deducting applicable processing charges as detailed in **Annexure 6**. Thus, the candidate will forfeit the eligibility for admissions to any of the institutes through DASA 2025.

51. There is no option of withdrawing an accepted/allotted seat after the commencement of last round of seat allocation.

52. The following is the process for withdrawal of a seat:

Step 1: The candidate must login to her/his seat allocation portal and submit a request for withdrawal by submitting a duly signed declaration form **Annexure 7** within the timelines given in **Annexure 3**.

Step 2: An OTP will be sent to the candidate's mobile number and email ID. The candidate shall use this OTP to confirm that the candidate wants to withdraw from seat allocation process. The candidate also confirms that this would result in cancellation of allocated seat and will not be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allocation (if any).

Step 3: The uploaded document in Step 1 will be verified by the reporting officer. Based on the verification, one of the following scenarios will happen:

1. Reporting officer will accept the request. The candidate's withdrawal request is accepted.
2. Reporting officer will reject the request based on the uploaded documentation and/or query response (see below). The candidate's withdrawal request is rejected.
3. Reporting officer raises a query to obtain additional documentation and/or to re-confirm that the candidate is interested to withdraw. The candidate will be required to respond to the query before the end of the query response period (see **Annexure 3**). Reporting officer will either accept or reject based on the query response, or raise another query, and the above process will be repeated.

53. The candidate can see the approved/rejected status of the withdrawal request on her/his seat allocation portal and download the approval/rejection letter. If the withdrawal application is rejected, the candidate can submit the request

again before the end of the second round of counselling with proper documentation.

54. The candidate will have the option to cancel a submitted withdrawal request through her/his seat allocation portal, if she/he wishes to do so, but only before the request is accepted by the reporting officer. An OTP will be sent to the candidate's mobile number and email ID, for cancelling the withdrawal request. The candidate shall use this OTP to confirm that she/he wants to cancel the withdrawal request from seat allocation process.

IX. Exercising 'Exit' option

55. A candidate, who has NOT been allotted a seat in DASA 2025, can EXIT from the seat allocation process through the seat allocation portal starting from the 1st round and up to the 2nd round of seat allocation, i.e. before the last round of seat allocation. Since DASA 2025 conducts a total of three rounds of seat allocation, candidates can exit until and including the second round of seat acceptance period. Please see **Annexure 3** for the timeline. Thus, the candidate will forfeit the eligibility for admission to any of the institutes as mentioned in **Annexure 1** through DASA 2025.
56. Candidates who have exercised exit option will NOT be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allotment (if any). Thus, the candidate will forfeit the eligibility for admissions to any of the participating institute.
57. There is no option of exit from seat allocation process after the commencement of last round of seat allocation.
58. The following is the process for Exit option from the seat allocation process of DASA 2025:

Step 1: The candidate must login to her/his seat allocation portal and submit a request for EXIT.

Step 2: An OTP will be sent to the candidate's mobile number and email ID.

The candidate will have to enter this OTP to confirm that the candidate wants to EXIT from the seat allocation process. The candidate will be shown a warning message on the consequence of exit.

Step 3: Upon confirming the EXIT, the request shall be processed online and the candidate will not be considered for subsequent rounds of seat allocation.

X. Change of class XII (or equivalent) passing status

59. Candidate will have options to declare the class XII (or equivalent) passing status as per the following during document uploading.

(A). Appeared the final examination and results awaited.

(B). Results declared and applied for re-totaling/re-evaluation.

(C). Final results declared (and NOT applied for re-totaling/re-evaluation).

If the candidate chooses an option 59(A) OR 59(B), they will be allowed for registration of DASA 2025 based on their declaration (as per the format given in **Annexure 1**). These candidates are required to prove their eligibility by providing class XII (or equivalent) passing status. The revision of passing status must be submitted by approaching the coordinating institute (NIT Rourkela) during seat allocation rounds OR to the admitting institute even after allotment/admission within September 30, 2025. If these candidates are unable to show their eligibility with class XII (or equivalent) passing status with at least 75% marks (OR 7.5 CGPA out of 10), their allotted seat and candidature will be cancelled.

If the candidate chooses an option 59(C), the candidature of the candidate will be verified after payment of DEF. Upon successful verification, the candidate will be allowed for choice filling for seat allotment.

XI. Change of Nationality

60. At the Time of Registration for DASA 2025

This section describes the application of specific rules when a candidate changes her/his nationality status at the time of DASA 2025 registration. It may be noted that all such candidates whose documents have been verified during JoSAA rounds cannot change their nationality. Please see **Annexure 8** for the definition of OCI/PIO (I) and OCI /PIO (F) nationality status.

Table 1 summarizes the possible change of nationality status at the time of DASA 2025 registration for the candidates who have registered for JEE (Advanced) 2025 and document verification not done during JoSAA 2025 rounds. The entries in the table refer to the clauses that are applicable for the respective change.

60B. The following rules will apply for the indicated nationality status change outlined in Table 1 and Table 2:

- a. The candidate has to produce proof of valid OCI/PIO card (issued before 04.03.2021) at the time of document upload stage.
- b. The candidate will be able to participate in DASA scheme provided the candidate appears in the Common Rank List of JEE (Main) 2025.
- c. There shall be no benefit of birth-category, PwD, and female supernumerary, and ineligible for DASA-CIWG seats.

60C. The following rules will apply for the indicated nationality status change outlined in Table 1 and Table 2:

- a. The candidate will have to submit a valid Indian passport or Voter ID along with documents of being an NRI to prove her/his claim.
- b. The candidate will be able to participate in DASA scheme provided the candidate appears in the Common Rank List of JEE (Main) 2025.

- c. The candidate will also be eligible for DASA-CIWG seats provided she/he fulfils the criteria for the same.

60D. The following rules will apply for the indicated nationality status change outlined in Table 1 and Table 2:

- a. The candidate has to produce proof of valid OCI/PIO card (issued before 04.03.2021) at the time of document upload stage.
- b. The candidate will be able to participate in DASA scheme provided the candidate appears in the Common Rank List of JEE (Main) 2025.

60E. The following rules will apply for the indicated nationality status change outlined in Table 1 and Table 2:

- a. The candidate will have to submit a valid Indian passport or Voter ID along with documents of being an NRI to prove her/his claim.
- b. The candidate will also be eligible for DASA-CIWG seats provided she/he fulfils the criteria for the same.

60F. The rules remain the same in this type of nationality status change mentioned in Table 1.

60G. The following rules will apply for the indicated nationality status change outlined in Table 1 and Table 2:

- 1. The candidate has to produce proof of valid OCI/PIO card at the time of online reporting/document pre-upload stage. The rules remain the same in this type of nationality status change mentioned in Table 1 and Table 2.

Please refer to the Section III for qualifying exam requirements for B.E./ B.Tech./ B.Arch./ B.Plan.

The following foreign examination have been recognized by Association of Indian Universities (AIU) as equivalent to 10+2 stage qualification of an Indian Board giving access to the Bachelor Degree programme at Indian Universities. In case candidate's qualification is not listed, they need to apply to AIU for an equivalence certificate. (For details Visit Association of Indian Universities website <http://www.aiu.ac.in>)

- (i) 12 years Baccalaureate Certificate of Chad, Gabon, France and Tunisia.
- (ii) International Baccalaureate Diploma awarded by International Baccalaureate Organization Geneva, Switzerland.

- Proof of 2 years of education (11th and 12th or equivalent) in foreign country in case of NRI (School leaving certificate/Mark sheets/Study Certificate as in **Annexure 13**).

Eligible candidates who have appeared/are appearing for the qualifying examination during the academic year 2023-24 / 2024-25 can also apply through DASA seat allocation process.

Notes:

- a. The transcripts/ marks/ grade sheets of the qualifying examination should be self-attested.
- b. If any supporting documents are in languages other than English or Hindi, authenticated translated copy of the documents in English or Hindi must also be provided.

[Note: If the original certificates are not in English/Hindi, English/Hindi version/translation of such certificates, duly certified by the Principal/Director or other competent authority of the graduating Institute, will be required during the verification of documents.]

- c. Candidate's name should be consistently same in passport and all required certificates.
- d. Incomplete/illegible applications and documentary evidences in any respect would be summarily rejected without any communication to the candidates.

- e. The candidates should ensure that the application is submitted timely. DASA 2025 Coordinating Institute, NIT Rourkela shall not be responsible for delays in online submission, if any.
- f. Candidates should submit the original marks card of the qualifying examination and all other documents at the time of admission at the allotted Institute or submit it within the dates specified by that Institute.

Original documents are to be produced at the time of admission at the allotted institute. The admitting institute will be responsible for verification of documents and ensuring that all required documents are available as per the rules.

Authentication of citizenship card for candidates from Nepal

Candidates applying under DASA Scheme 2025 from Nepal should submit (online) a copy of the authenticated residence proof (Passport or Citizenship card) along with the online application form, to be eligible for considering their application. Candidates can contact Embassy of India in Kathmandu, Nepal or Embassy of Nepal at New Delhi for verification and authentication of the residential proof certificates. Candidates should submit authenticated residential proof documents at the time of admission failing which the provisional admission granted would be cancelled. Hence candidates from Nepal applying under DASA Scheme 2025 are strongly advised to start the authentication process immediately by contacting the office of Embassy of Nepal at New Delhi or Embassy of India in Kathmandu, Nepal at the earliest, so that they will be able to submit the authenticated residential proof certificates at the time of admission.

In addition to the above documents, the verifying officials will also check the special eligibility conditions, if any, for all the choices including and above the seat allotted to the candidate.

Notes:

- (i) NRI candidates who are eligible for CIWG Category will have the option

to be considered for other seats of DASA as well. In order to avail this option, the candidates have to deposit the same initial fee as applicable to DASA (Non-SAARC) category candidates.

- (v) Candidates who have participated in JoSAA-2025 and have been allotted seats in NIT+ System and have already SECURED ADMISSION at the allotted institute by paying the Seat Acceptance Fee (SAF) and Partial Admission Fee (PAF), are also eligible for DASA seat allocation provided they fulfill the criteria as given in Section III. These candidates will be participating in DASA Rounds while retaining their seats for which they have paid PAF during JoSAA 2025 rounds. These candidates will be participating in DASA Rounds as fresh after payment of the required DASA Enrollment Fee (DEF). Foreign Nationals and OCI/PIO Candidates**A. Foreign Nationals**

Candidates who are NOT citizens of India (by birth or naturalized) shall be considered as foreign nationals. Such candidates are also eligible for seat allocation through DASA 2025 Seat Allocation Process.

B. OCI/PIO Candidates

In light of the recent judicial pronouncement¹ concerning OCI/PIO candidates, the following provisions are made for such candidates.

OCI/PIO candidates who have obtained their OCI/PIO cards before 04.03.2021 have the option of registration for JoSAA 2025 EITHER as (a) foreign nationals OR (b) at par with Indian nationals. Accordingly, OCI/PIO candidates are divided into three categories as follows:

- (i) Those OCI/PIO candidates who have obtained their OCI/PIO cards subsequent to 04.03.2021² will be considered as foreign national candidates and will be governed by the eligibility conditions contained herein for the foreign national candidates. For ease of convenience, these candidates are referred to as OCI/PIO (F). The OCI/PIO (F) candidates are also eligible for seat allocation.
- (ii) Those OCI/PIO candidates who have obtained their OCI/PIO cards before 04.03.2021 AND choose to be considered as foreign nationals, will be governed by the eligibility conditions contained herein for the foreign national candidates and are also referred to as OCI/PIO (F). The OCI/PIO (F) candidates will also be eligible for seat allocation.
- (iii) Those OCI/PIO candidates who have obtained their OCI/PIO cards before 04.03.2021 AND choose to be treated at par with Indian nationals, will be governed by the eligibility conditions contained herein for the Indian national candidates and are referred to as OCI/PIO (I).

OCI/PIO candidates who neither registered for JEE (Advanced) 2025 nor for JoSAA 2025 and have obtained their OCI/PIO cards before 04.03.2021 are advised to choose their option (OCI/PIO (I) or OCI/PIO (F)) carefully. These candidates have to exercise their options while registering for “DASA and CSAB-Special” Seat Allocation 2025.

OCI/PIO candidates who have registered for JEE (Advanced) 2025 and/or document verification not done during JoSAA 2025 rounds and have obtained their OCI/PIO cards before 04.03.2021 will be asked to confirm their choice of OCI/PIO(I) or OCI/PIO(F) while registering for “DASA and CSAB-Special” Seat Allocation 2025.

OCI/PIO candidates whose documents have been verified during JoSAA 2025 rounds are NOT allowed to change their nationality for the purposes of the DASA/CSAB-Special Rounds.

The options once exercised by the candidate cannot be changed and shall remain the same for all further seat allocation processes.

Additional rules and general instructions

Visa Requirement

All allotted foreign nationals must obtain a valid student visa as applicable to their category issued by the Indian Missions abroad. The visa can be obtained by producing the provisional admission letter and other required documents at the Indian Missions located in their respective country. ***Additionally, the foreign national candidates are advised to get registered with unique registration ID from 'Study in India' Portal after the allotment under DASA using the link: <https://studyinindia.gov.in/>***

Medical Examination

The candidates are advised to ensure that they are medically fit to pursue the prescribed course of study. The candidates are required to submit the Medical Certificate as per the format given in **Annexure 10** from an authorized medical practitioner in their home country or India. In addition, the candidates may be required to undergo a medical fitness test at the time of reporting at concerned Institute. Please note that if the applicant is not medically fit, her/ his admission is likely to be cancelled.

Reporting at the Institute

Candidates who have been provisionally allotted a seat in an Institution in any of the Rounds have to report for admission in these Institutions as per schedule mentioned on DASA website. The start of the academic session for 2025-26 would be announced later by the respective Institutes. The details regarding the documents/ certificates to be submitted at the time of reporting at the Institute can be checked with respective Institutes.
